### 2013 Special Olympic BC Summer Games spirit alive in Langley

# Athletes, supporters kick off the Games and Fill the Stands campaign with inclusive basketball game

Langley fans came together today to kick off the 2013 Special Olympics BC Summer Games with a fun, inclusive basketball game that showcased the skills of local Special Olympics BC (SOBC) athletes and the great support the community is showing to the Games.

The centrepiece of today's launch was a basketball game involving members of the SOBC – Langley Warriors, a team that has been training hard for the 2013 Provincial Games, taking on challengers in the form of Langley RCMP members, Trinity Western University Spartans players, and R.E. Mountain Secondary School athletes.

Thanks to Basketball BC, the game also benefitted from all-star officiating from celebrity referees Allison and Mike McNeill, former Senior Women's National Team coaches now working with Basketball BC.

While the matchup proved to be a lot of fun for all, the game itself wasn't the objective – it was part of a much larger vision, as described by 2013 SOBC Summer Games Chair Arne Olson.

"The bigger picture is that persons with an intellectual disability, wherever they are, have the right to pursue excellence, just like anybody else. They have the right to dream big, just like anybody else. And they have the right to push past their limits, to compete and excel, to experience the joy of teamwork, the passion of sport, to leave it all on the field, just like anybody else. And that is what this Provincial Games is all about," Olson said.

From July 11 to 14, more than 1,100 athletes with intellectual disabilities will converge on Langley from communities all across B.C. and the Yukon to give their best and go for gold in 11 sports. Supported by 400 coaches as well as their friends and family cheering them on, they will light up Langley on that July weekend.

The launch also saw Olson kick off the Fill the Stands campaign for the Games, encouraging all locals to be a fan and come out to the events to "cheer on these athletes and help them on toward their personal best." The display of sportsmanship, skill, dedication, and joy won't be found anywhere else.

Approximately 1,000 local volunteers are being sought to give their time in support of this life-changing experience.

"Special Olympics changes lives," SOBC Chair Pam Keith said at Wednesday's event. "It gives athletes with intellectual disabilities opportunities to empower themselves through their achievements, the friendships they develop, and the inclusion and encouragement they experience on their teams and in their programs. It gives them the chance to take centre stage in their communities and be accepted and celebrated for all that they can do. And everyone who gets involved with them is changed for the better too."
